

Plots for members are available in the newer section of our cemetery behind the Christian Education Building for traditional underground caskets/vaults. Cremains can also be interred in the Memorial Garden

Summary of Cemetery Rules

Burial Plots and Memorials

- Burial plots measure either 6 ft 8 in x 10 feet for doubles or 3 ft 4 in x 10 for singles.
- Vaults are required for all interments.
- All plots are sold as "Perpetual Care" and the Cemetery Care Committee has the right to maintain the grounds as appropriate in regard to ground settlement, flower placement, grass cutting and other grounds maintenance.
- All memorials, raised or flush, are the responsibility of the cemetery burial plot owner(s), or heirs, including the responsibility of maintenance.
- No permanent plantings will be permitted on cemetery burial plots unless approved by the Cemetery Committee based on a long term view of the Rules Governing Dutch Neck Burial Ground.

Memorial Garden



Burial in the Memorial Garden will consist of cremains placed in biodegradable containers and placed in the designated area around the Garden Marker.

No memorial markers will be placed in the area for the biodegradable container. Individual names and dates may be etched on the Garden Marker by a church designated company and paid for by plot owner.

Cremains in permanent urns (marble or concrete) may be buried in traditional plots (2 urns/single plot; 4 urns/double plot) - refer to rules above regarding placement of memorial markers.
